

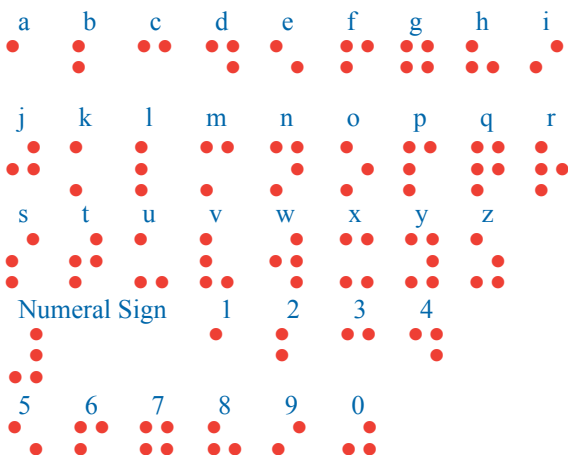

Braille Alphabet and Numbers



The six dots of the Braille cell are arranged and numbered thus:

1	●	●	4
2	●	●	5
3	●	●	6

The capital sign, dot 6, placed before a letter, makes it a capital. The numeral sign, dots 3, 4, 5, 6, placed before a character, makes it a number and not a letter. Braille punctuation marks are formed by using dots in the lower part of the cell.
